Lines of research & scholarship



Research collaboration: Sarah Gutin

- Using retrospective cohort study data (1R01MH104132, Pl Camlin) to conduct longitudinal multilevel analyses exploring impacts of mobility on HIV risk behaviors in rural couples in Kenya/Uganda
 - Key finding: Sexual risk behaviors within couples are impacted by typologies of mobility, and gender of mobile partner.
- K01 proposal submitted to NIMH examining approaches for improving male engagement in safer conception/ sexual and reproductive health (SRH) in context of mobility in Kenya
- UCSF RAP grant application submitted Development of novel scales to measure HIV-specific social support for safer conception and male involvement in safer conception approaches for the prevention of HIV

Mobility in SEARCH sub-studies


- RAP grant: Distinct forms of human mobility are differentially associated with HIV treatment adherence
 - uses Mobility in SEARCH data + hair ARV concentrations as metric of adherence, manuscript under review
- CFAR Administrative Supplement: Geospatial & temporal analyses of HIVrelated risk factors in mobile populations
 - Two secondary data analyses (one spatial, one latent trajectory model) examining mobility among persons living with HIV in association with risk of onward transmission
 - One qualitative study examining how mobility influences attitudes/preferences re: PrEP in pregnant/postpartum women (first interviews conducted this week!)




